## Wound, Ostomy, and Continence Nursing Certification Board Honors Duke Raleigh Hospital with 2011 Employer Recognition Award

**MILWAUKEE, Wisconsin, June 22, 2011** The Wound, Ostomy, and Continence Nursing Certification Board (WOCNCB) announced that Duke Raleigh Hospital, Raleigh, NC, is the recipient of the 2011 WOCNCB Employer Recognition Award. The award was presented on June 6<sup>th</sup> at the 2011 Annual Conference of the Wound, Ostomy and Continence Nursing Society in New Orleans. Accepting the award on the behalf of Duke Raleigh was Janet Holliday-Cashwell, EdD, Administrative Director Employee Services, and Krystyna Dixon, BA, RN, CWOCN, CFCN, who nominated her facility for the award.

According to the WOCNCB Awards Committee Chair Marilyn Swindle, DNP, MBA, RN, CWOCN, the WOCNCB Employer Recognition Award is given annually to honor an organization that demonstrates exceptional value and support of certification for wound, ostomy or continence (WOC) nurses.

"As the Awards Committee evaluated the nomination materials submitted for this award, several actions stood out," explained Dr. Swindle. Duke Raleigh Hospital values, encourages, celebrates, rewards and financially supports educational activities of its certified nurses, including conference fees, lodging and air fare for professional conferences. In the days following Haiti's earthquake, Duke Raleigh Hospital encouraged Ms. Dixon to move forward with her desire to volunteer and later reimbursed all her expenses." Duke Raleigh also recognized the value of WOC nursing by creating another part time WOC position and by creating and supporting the Outpatient Hospital Services Ostomy Clinic.

"I have been in nursing for over 25 years," explained Ms. Dixon, "and it is with real joy that I come to work each day, for I know I am truly appreciated. I believe you will find few other organizations such as this nominee that support the WOCNCB philosophy of providing excellence in patient care."

Duke Raleigh Hospital, a part of the Duke University Health System, is a 186-bed acute-care facility with services including a cancer center, orthopaedic center, diabetes center, wound healing center, 24-hour emergency department, intensive and critical care, cardiovascular center, cardiac and pulmonary rehab, wellness services and community education.
